

## WESTON CREEK DIARY OF EVENTS

[I came across this typed document folded in the middle of a book *CITY AND RURAL LEASES In the Australian Capital Territory 1924-70. June 1970* Department of the Interior.]

Weston Creek is named after George Edward Weston a former officer in the East India Company who arrived in Australia in 1825 and was granted land here in 1841. Ultimately Weston Creek will be home for 34000 people.

Distance from Civic Centre to Information Centre – 10 miles.

Height of nearby hills – Oakey – 2250 feet above sea level – Taylor – 2807 feet above sea level.

### Development

- 1968 July Landservicing began in Waramanga (named after and Aboriginal Tribe in Central Australia)
- August Landservicing began in Fisher (named after Andrew Fisher Prime Minister 1908-15)
- 1969 February Contracts let for first Government houses
- March First Group Auctions
- May Primary School buildings began in Waramanga
- June First Government house handed over to the Department of the Interior
- September Hindmarsh Drive extension open  
First Government house occupied  
Bus service began 'Weston Creek Services' issued  
Road link between Hindmarsh Drive and Cotter Road began.
- October First Restricted and Unrestricted auctions in Waramanga  
Population estimate 150
- November Tenders called for second Primary School – Weston Creek 1
- December Waramanga Shop sites auctioned  
First Group Auctions in 1  
First Restricted Auctions in Fisher  
First Unrestricted Auctions in Fisher  
Roads – Caswell Drive open (Link between Belconnen and Woden – Weston Creek.)  
NCDC Information Centre open. Telephone connected  
Population estimate – 500 Waramanga – 370  
Fisher - 130
- 1970 January Transfer of Repatriation Officers  
Population estimate – 750 Waramanga – 550  
Fisher - 200  
Contract let for Primary School in Weston Creek 1
- February Committee formed for Pre-School  
Pre-School in Nemrang Cres opened Teacher – Miss Judith Murphy  
NCDC Information Office open on Sunday afternoon.
- March 61<sup>st</sup> Auction  
First auction Restricted and Unrestricted land in 1  
First auction of Group blocks in Weston Creek 5  
Church sites handed back in Waramanga Fisher and 1  
Site requested in Group Centre; revised map of  
Provisional Distribution of Church sites issued.
- April Population estimates – 1000 Waramanga – 750  
Fisher - 350  
Bishop Warren conducted first service in a home 25

- May First private house occupied in Weston Creek q  
62<sup>nd</sup> Land Auction  
Interest rate raised on Housing loan  
Housing Tour for ACROSS conference
- June Sacred Heard Primary School open in Pearce
- July 63<sup>rd</sup> Land Auction  
Fisher Shops and Service Station auctioned  
First private blocks in Rivett (5)  
Bus time table and route revised to serve Weston  
613 occupied homes  
Population estimate – 2200
- August Waramanga Primary School occupied  
Baby Health Centre open – every Tuesday Sister Lang  
Social worker (Welfare Interior) uses NCDC Information  
Centre on Monday and Tuesday afternoons.  
Community Meeting to assess community needs,  
Black ban on Juiland House, Phillip,  
Waramanga Shop open – Mini Market and Chemist,  
Notices up re ‘Group Housing’ and ‘Institutions’.
- September 64<sup>th</sup> Land Auction  
Shop and dwelling auctioned in Weston.  
Contract let for Weston Creek High School,  
First Private house occupied in Rivett,  
First clergyman takes up residence, 2 Weipa Place, Fisher,  
Phone 881415  
Induction at school, 27 September 1970/  
NCDC Annual Report released.
- October Church Services begin in School, 8.00 am Mass  
9.30 am Joint Church.
